Movie plots

Without A Paddle (PG-13) — Three friends (Seth Green, Matthew Lillard and Dax Shepard) from Philadelphia go canoeing in the mountains of Washington State after the death of a friend. The trio soon finds their canoeing experience going wrong as the river turns dangerous and they have an encounter with a crazy mountain man (Burt Reynolds).

Two Brothers (PG) — Twin tiger brothers born in the temple ruins of French Indo-China are separated as cubs and taken into captivity. One is forced to become a circus performer, the other a trained killer. Years later the brothers find themselves reunited, but as enemies pitted against each other.

Anacondas: The Hunt For The Blood Orchid (PG-13) — A scientific expedition heads to the jungles of Borneo to search for a rare black orchid that may unlock the secrets of youth and immortality. They discover the orchid is already being used by a powerful group — a swarm of giant snakes that derive their strength, size and vitality from the flowers.

White Chicks (PG-13) — Shawn and Marlon Wayans star as two ambitious but unlucky FBI agents who go deep undercover as female, high society debutantes to infiltrate the sophisticated world of the Hamptons to investigate a kidnapping ring.


Alien Vs. Predator — The monsters from two of the scariest film franchises ever battle each other on Earth. The discovery of an ancient pyramid buried in Antarctica sends a team of scientists and adventurers to the frozen continent. There, they make an even more terrifying discovery: two alien races engaged in the ultimate battle.

The Manchurian Candidate (R) — Denzel Washington stars as Maj. Bennett Marco, a career Soldier who grows suspicious about his experience in Operation Desert Storm after Squad Sergeant Raymond Shaw (Liev Schreiber), son of the powerful Senator Eleanor Shaw (Meryl Streep), becomes a candidate for vice president.

The Chronicles Of Riddick (PG-13) — Vin Diesel is back as anti-hero Richard B. Riddick. He's spent the last five years on the move among the forgotten worlds on the outskirts of the galaxy eluding mercenaries bent on collecting the price on his head. Now he must fight for his survival once again.

Anchorman (PG-13) — Will Ferrell stars as Ron Burgundy, the top-rated anchorman in San Diego in the '70s. When feminism marches into the newsroom in the form of newswoman Veronica Corningstone (Christina Applegate), Ron is willing to play along as long as Veronica stays in her place, covering cat fashion shows, cooking and other "female" interests.

Greifenstein-Beilstein—This first-ever *Drei Burgen Wanderung* event is west of Giessen and a bit distant for all but the most dedicated wanderers. From Giessen use B-49 west to Biskirchen and an unnumbered road north through Greifenstein to the start at Beilstein. Drivers on Autobahn 45 may use the Herborn-Süd or Ehringhausen exits to follow IVV signs to the start.
